

Encouragement & Equipping in Prayer



The *One Church - One Day* Leadership Team desires to assist the Body of Christ in growing in prayer. Below, are some of the foundational teachings that we teach at the prayer center. We'd love to share one, or all of these, in any setting that would benefit your church. The options and ways to present these are entirely up to you, but here are some ideas:

- A Saturday morning for men's or women's groups
 - A weekend seminar for the prayer teams or entire church
 - A youth event (one night or a weekend)
 - One night a week for four weeks, as part of regular classes
 - For a Sunday school class (one session or more)
 - A Sunday morning or Sunday evening session
 - Teaching for a home group
1. **Prayer is Relationship:** This is the core reason and motivation to pray. Looking at Jesus' life, and being disciples ourselves, we see a devoted prayer life, connecting Him to the Father as our model. Prayer becomes less focused on getting answers alone, but getting to know God himself!
 2. **Praying in Jesus' Name:** Based on John 14, 15, and 16, this teaching gives us confidence and faith to know how to pray as we base our prayer on the person of Jesus and His finished work on the cross. We focus on what the cross has done for all who believe and how to access that in prayer.
 3. **The Character and Promises of God:** Praying the Word of God as we focus on the attributes, the promises and purposes of God.
 4. **Principles of Intercession:** This teaching helps us know how to come before the Lord, learn to hear his voice, and pray things that are on his heart.
 5. **Dynamic Corporate Prayer:** When we pray together as a group, so much can happen with agreement together. This is different than our individual prayer closet or private times. When we come together to seek the heart of God, He enables us to make a unified sound, like a symphony as He leads us.
 6. **Praying the Lord's Prayer:** This is more than a formula to be repeated, but a pattern of all the ways God wants us to ask and participate in His kingdom through praying.
